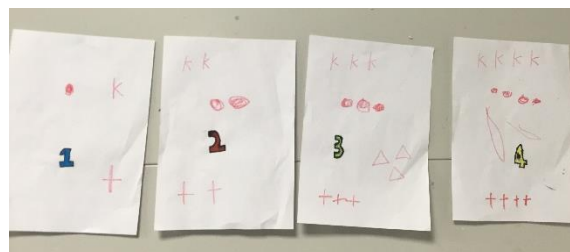
### Sage
